I also will have a clear and easy to read rubric that corresponds with each assignment. I don't think I will give the students a specific time that they should spend working on the assignment, because I think it will vary from student to student. As long as the assignment is completed in accordance with the rubric, the students will receive a good grade.

I will keep up with grading by not assigning more than I can handle. By assigning limited amounts of homework, I should be able to stay on top of the things that I do assign in my class. I also plan on having students peer review each other's papers and help make corrections so that when I correct them, there should be less to correct. If I do assign the online discussion boards in my class, I plan on using technology to make the grading process easier on myself. I will not give out zeros in my class after seeing what that can do to a student's grade as well. I will be flexible when it comes to late work depending on how the student handles the situation. Overall, I do not want to assign anything that the students will not benefit from or find engaging. I want my students to see my class as a learning environment rather than an obstacle to get done with.
